- 4) The name changes passed with the exception of D6 which was defeated and SW who withdrew their motion.
- 5) The other resolutions thanking the Province, OMAFRA and D14 passed.

Next year's convention is in Cornwall with a theme of "A RIVER RUNS BY ".D1 has only 7 societies which means a convention is a big job in terms of hosting. Being next door neighbours here in D3 I hope that we can pitch in and perhaps some of us can be volunteers at the convention as well as attending.
